



WHAT IS EUCHARISTIC ADORATION?

It is simply adoring and honoring the Eucharistic presence of Jesus.

The Eucharist is Jesus himself, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity under the appearance of bread in the Consecrated Host.

During Eucharistic Adoration, we remain “silent” in His presence and open ourselves to His graces which flow from the Eucharist.

The Lord draws us to Himself and transforms us.

The Blessed Sacrament is exposed in a monstrance.

A priest or deacon removes the Sacred Host from the tabernacle and places it in the monstrance on the altar for Adoration.

The monstrance is a vessel used by the church to display the Consecrated Host during Eucharistic Adoration.

At all other times, the reserved Sacrament is kept locked in the tabernacle in the church.

During the time that you spend with our Lord in Eucharistic Adoration, you may want to read the Holy Bible, pray the Holy Rosary, read about the lives of the saints, or just simply enjoy the peace of spending time with Jesus.

Throughout the year, there are many devotions and special feast days that present opportunities to spend time with our Lord.

Every Tuesday, Eucharistic Adoration follows the 8:15am Holy Mass and ends at 9:00pm with benediction and every First Friday following the 8:15am Holy Mass and ending at 10:00pm with benediction.
