My Dear Parishioners,

At the time of Saint Paul, the believers in the city of Corinth must have been extremely excited about their faith. It was an extremely vibrant Christian

community. There were people who were tremendously gifted, and they were using those talents wisely. There were teachers and healers and those who could speak in tongues. There were those who could lead in prayer and worship and there were talented preachers as well. There were also those in the helping ministries, and the Word of God was both proclaimed and lived every day.

The Gospel message was wonderful! The people proclaimed and gloried in Jesus risen from the dead, who came to save us and to give us the gift of everlasting life. The people of Corinth had every reason to rejoice. Or did they?

In our second reading, Saint Paul is telling those people that while everything may have seem to be wonderful, that something was actually very wrong. We might say that they had failed the “taste test.” All of the other ingredients were there, but something very important was missing! It was like chocolate cake without the sugar or like a loaf of bread without yeast. One of the essential elements of Christian life was deficient. There Church had failed the taste because of a lack of **love**.

Paul then goes on to speak of love in a very beautiful and poetic way. He speaks of all of the attributes of *real* love: it is patient and forgiving and kind. It is not pompous or inflated or rude. In all of this, Paul makes it very clear that love is much *more than* an emotion or a feeling. Love involves a **decision** and it involves **action**. We must choose to love and we must **do something** to show our love.

Today might be a good time for all of us at Saint Jane’s to question whether we are able to pass Saint Paul’s “taste test.” We have a wonderful parish. It is a true Christian community. There are many wonderful activities that take place here. There are many people who give of their time, talent and treasure. Hopefully, that essential ingredient is also present. The important thing is love. Love is the test. Love is the yardstick by which we can measure ourselves.

The message of St. Paul is one that all of us need to take to heart. He tells us that it doesn’t matter if you can speak out for God, or if you know all mysteries, or can heal all diseases.

If you don’t have love, it is all of no consequence whatever. Today we pray that we might always look to the great love Our Lord Jesus has shown toward us and that we might always be animated by that love as well!
